Supervisor Brown welcomed everyone and announced that the meeting was going to be recorded for his reference and that his wife Betsy was going to run the recorder. He asked if there were any objections. There were none.

Minutes

Mr. Jeffrey moved, Mr. Proskine seconded, to approve the minutes from the 12/16/19 and the 1/2/20 meetings, discussion, all ayes. Supervisor Brown stated that the minutes by law are to be available within 2 weeks of the meeting and asked that in the future the minutes be available in that time frame.

Mr. Brown informed the Board the Highway Dept. has payroll direct deposited and that option is available to everyone Enforcement Officer - Mr. Prisco's wife passed away recently. He left a message that he was going to step back for a while

Assessor Rochelle Harris received a letter from Thomas Ventra, owner of 113 Ed Henry Spur, concerning a dispute with his assessment and taxes. The letter along with the response sent to him by Assessor Harris were read to the Board. Mr. Brown stated the Town Attorney has been made aware. At this point we just need to wait and see if Mr. Ventra follows through with any action.

Old Business

*Beaver issue - Corcoran

It has been reported that the beaver issue was quietly resolved for now. Mr. Edwards plans to check with the NYSDEC about assisting with the ongoing problem.

*Gym / Classroom Floors

The classroom floor has been repaired and the gym floor has been refinished. Mr. Brown is looking to meet with Karen Randall, Head Start, to attempt to get some assistance for the cost of repairing the classroom floor. He thinks that the black spot indicates that at some point there must have been a water problem. He is hoping that Head Start could pay at least 1/2 of the cost. Mr. Proskine asked about renting runners for the Town Hall. Supt. Eldred is getting prices to rent and will also check with pricing on purchasing them.

Norwich Meadows Farm

supervisor Brown reported that Norwich Meadows Farm wants to put processing in part of the incubator building at the IDA Business ouilding at the airport. The plan also calls for housing in the other part of the building. Norwich Meadows applied through the Planning Board a couple months ago. Mr. Brown thinks this should have come before the Town Board.

*NBT Insurance

David Craine, NBT Insurance, is asking for the Board's decision on the additional crime insurance and the cyber insurance. Mr. Proskine moved, Mr. Santiago seconded, to decline the additional coverage, discussion, all ayes.

New Business

*Cost cutting measures

-Supervisor Brown proposed cutting the spending limit to \$250 on frivolous spending. Supt. Eldred provided the Board with a copy of the Town of Plymouth Procurement Policy. Currently, North Norwich's policy is up to \$1,000 is up to the purchaser. Mr. Eldred explained that he doesn't think any of the spending is frivolous. He added that he wouldn't be able to buy tires, oil, etc. What if he needs a new tire? Wait for a Board meeting? Mr. Brown said that he can call him and if he thinks the purchase is warranted he will ok it. Mr. Brown said they can call, email other Board members. Mr. Eldred told Mr. Brown that when communication was done in that manner before he (Mr. Brown) was totally against it. Mr. Eldred says he gets price comparisons. Mr. Brown reminded him that the Town has very little income. Mr. Eldred said he has had more communication with the Board than they had in the past. Mr. Edwards stated that Supt. Eldred has been responsible and is not frivolous. Mr. Santiago thinks the Board should look at what other Towns have in place. Supt. Eldred will contact some other Towns to get copies of their procurement policies.

-Mr. Brown told the Board that the only training required is mandatory training. Highway doesn't have mandatory training. He spoke with Judge Matott who confirmed that he and the Court Clerk both have mandatory annual training. Mr. Eldred said they do a lot of their training in house. Mr. Brown added that Matt at the County has all the training materials they need.

-Mr. Brown spoke with Jason Lawrence about putting the contract together with the Town and BOCES for using a repeater. Mr. Brown said there will likely be a charge. Mr. Eldred said Jason told him it would be a minimal charge. It looks like the location will be Skinner Hill.

-Mr. Brown said there is a problem with Mr. Eldred's insurance buyout. It cannot go toward the state retirement. Mr. Brown will stop the buyout and re-negotiate. Mr. Edwards spoke that this is a personnel matter and should be discussed in executive session. This discussion is tabled until later in the evening and will be in executive session.

Public Concern

Audra Mikalunas

Mrs. Mikalunas asked the Board to address the lack of cellular telephone coverage along the Route 12 corridor. Sherburne's Mayor Acee sent a letter to AT & T a while ago over this issue. From Parks Rd. to the Landfill there are numerous dead zones. Also, Mrs. Mikalunas asks Supervisor Brown to encourage the County to sell by bid the approx. 30 acres of land they still own that was once a part of the sand bed. And, she would like to see the Town enforce the local laws on file that would cleanup properties around Town instead of focusing on property owners who are trying to cleanup their property. Mr. Brown said the Town is trying do some cleaning up. When Mr. Prisco comes back he has some properties he is looking at already. Mrs. Mikalunas promised to come back in the future to follow upon these issues.

Claude Christian

Mr. Christian said he came to the meeting over the recent Evening Sun news article covering the social the Board hosted last week. In the article he says Mr. Brown was quoted as saying the Town has only 1 business, a car dealership. Mr. Christian said he can name at least 20 more businesses very easily. Mr. Brown stated he did not say that. Mr. Christian also said he doesn't think the Town needs a grocery store or gas staion, that Sherburne and Norwich are closeby. He added that he likes where he lives and would like to be able to afford staying right here.

Josh Hough

Mr. Hough, who lives in North Park Estates, said his taxes are very, very high. He said he could go through the grievance process but then it shifts the tax burden to others. He asked the Board if it is time for a re-val? Much discussion followed on assessments and revaluation. The Board has decided to ask Assessor Harris to attend the next meeting. Mr. Hough encouraged the Board to take action sooner rather than later. He also asked if meeting minutes are online. The Clerk has copies of minutes available the night of the meeting.

Buildings and Grounds

Supt. Eldred said he had received an email from Supervisor Brown concerning the property line of the Town and the Mikalunas property. In the email Mr. Brown mentioned that Mr. Mikalunas was cutting some trees and wondered if the Supt. knew where the property line was. Mrs. Mikalunas spoke up and said her property has been surveyed and she knows where her line is. She added it is quite possible that part of the park path is on her property. Maybe the Town should have their property surveyed.

Head Start

Supt. Eldred brought up Head Start using the emergency exit door as an entry. Mr. Brown said he has looked at the contract and there is no stipulation concerning what door they can or cannot use.

Preferred Vendor list

Mr. Brown would like to see a list of who is to be called with certain issues, plumbing, heating, electric, etc. Mr. Eldred said he has scheduled Avolio Brothers to come on January 30th to assess the heat zone issue with the Head Start office and the Town Meeting room. There was discussion of having the furnace serviced each year. Mr. Edwards moved, Mr. Jeffrey seconded, to allow Supt. Eldred to meet with Avolio's to look at the furnace and heat zone issue, discussion, all ayes.

Highway

Loader

Supt. Eldred reported to the Board about the loader. Right now the 2 years is almost up, the original plan was to swap it at 2 years so that we would always have a loader under warranty. For a cost of \$19,000 CAT will bring in a new machine, cross out the old vin # and write in the new vin # on the contract. We still have 3 payments left on the contract. It will take about 6 more years to see the savings advantage by swapping every couple years. CAT parts and service are always available. Following discussion, Mr. Jeffrey moved, Mr. Santiago seconded, to approve swapping the loader back to CAT for a new one amended into the original contract at a cost of \$19,000., discussion, all ayes.

Supt. Eldred emailed the Board his monthly report for December 2019. A copy is filed with the Town Clerk where it is available for review.

Head Start Office Heating Issue

All the radiators have been cleaned which has helped with the heat in the Head Start Office. Supt. Eldred has estimates from Rogers Contracting to lower ceiling \$ 4,134. to add heater \$1,142. or to replace door \$1,442. also an estimate from Central Plumbing to add heater \$1,140. Following review of options, Mr. Proskine moved, Mr. Edwards seconded, to hire Rogers Contracting to replace the outside door for \$1,442., discussion, all ayes.

Loader

Supt. Eldred explained to the Board about the difference in the amount of down payment to \$18,000. for swapping the loader for a new one. Their was a misunderstanding with warranty coverage on the loader. It was covered 100 % parts and labor for 1st year, after that just parts only. CAT decided to absorb the \$1,000 labor cost by reducing the amount required to trade it out to \$18,000 instead of \$19,000. The Town will pay still pay \$19,000 but \$1,000 will be for the labor on the repairs and the \$18,000 will be the cost of the swap. Mr. Edwards moved, Mr. Jeffrey seconded, to authorize the new loader with the revised figures, discussion, all ayes.

Supervisor Brown informed the Board that Frank Tiffany would develop a website for the Town. Mr. Tiffany developed one for the Town of Norwich. Mr. Santiago moved, Mr. Proskine seconded to hire Frank Tiffany to develop a Town Website, discussion, all ayes. ***Park Committee**

Supervisor Brown told the Board that there are people interested in serving on a Park Committee with the possibility of bringing back the picnic that we had for the community. Mr. Brown added that someone wants to make a donation to start funding for the Park. Mr. Jeffrey moved, Mr. Proskine seconded, to authorize Supervisor Brown to ask the Town Attorney about developing a Park Committee, discussion, all ayes.

*Sherburne Youth Agreement

The 2020 Youth Agreement with Sherburne is \$2,040. Mr. Eldred questioned what the funds are used for adding that his children play little league and Sherburne has now joined with Norwich with a cost of \$40/child. The Clerk read from a copy of the programs budget that is attached to the agreement. It appears that the vast majority of the budget is for the Sherburne Pool at Paddleford Park. The Clerk told the Board that the State re-imburses the Town 50% of the cost. Mr. Proskine moved, Mr. Edwards seconded, to authorize Supervisor Brown to sign the agreement for 2020, discussion, all ayes.

Public Concern

Josh Hough

-Supervisor Brown asked Mr. Hough, who lives in North Park Estates, if he would like to be on a Park Committee. He indicated he may be interested. Council Member Joe Santiago said he is the one that wants to make a donation for the Park. He hasn't taken any pay for being on the Council and wants it to go to the Park. Mr. Hough asked if they have a fire pit so that they could do a chicken bar-b-que fundraiser? Supt. Eldred said the only thing they have are a bar-b-que grill at each pavilion that he installed last year. Mr. Hough thinks a website is a great idea. There was also discussion about setting up a facebook page.

-Mr. Hough asked Mr. Brown about re-val. He stated Mr. Brown is not in favor of one but also recognizes there are inequities and that the Assessor has some other ideas so he asked what the other ideas are. Mr. Brown told him he should talk with the Assessor. Mr. Hough stated he has and was directed to talk with the Town Board. Mr. Brown told him he can always grieve his assessment. Mr. Hough knows he can grieve but added that if all those in his development file a grievance and they are successful then all they have done is shift the tax burden onto others. This does not fix the problem. Again, Mr. Brown advised him to talk with the Assessor. Mr. Edwards stated that there is a person that attends our meetings, when not in Florida during the winter months, that can probably explain everything about re-vals and equalization rates better than the Town Board can.

-Mr. Hough also asked about the Norwich Rural Fire taxes, he thought North Norwich has a volunteer department. It was explained to Mr. Hough that his property lies within an area of Town that is contracted with the City of Norwich for fire protection. His property is not within the North Norwich Fire District. Mr. Jeffrey explained that North Norwich Fire District has difficulty getting volunteers enough to respond to the calls within the district so they are not looking to take on any bigger area than they already have. Mr. Hough thinks that the Town Board should do something about it because he pays twice as much for fire protection because of where his property is located. Mr. Brown suggested to Mr. Hough that he go to the North Norwich Fire Dept. meeting and ask them to cover the area wher he live. Mr. Jeffrey said they meet on the last Wed. every month at 7 pm.

Mr. Edwards only suggested an electric because that would keep the boiler from running in order to have hot water. Go with a 40 gal instead of a 50 like we have now. Also talked about a tankless heater. Get an estimate from Reese-Marshall and a couple others.

New Business

*Assessments

Supervisor Brown has been in communication with Josh Hough, North Park Estates resident. Mr. Hough had received an email from Assessor Harris indicating the right way to fix the inequities is a re-valuation. Mr. Brown also shared the email with Mr. Curtis. Mr. Brown asked the Board for a resolution saying we do not want to do a re-val at this time. Mr. Edwards wants to wait until the whole Board is in attendance to discuss this and pass a resolution. Actually, Mr. Edwards would like Mr. Hough and the others asking about this and Tom Curtis, BAR Chair, here as well. Mr. Brown said we will just table this then.

*Verizon Tower

Supervisor Brown has had a phone call from Verizon to put a cell tower in our backyard so the Town can get revenue for it . All the Board thinks this is a great idea. Mr. Brown thinks the way the woman talked it would be on Town land. Mr. Edwards doesn't think there is anyplace with a high enough elevation that the Town owns. Mr. Brown said maybe the woods in the back of the park. Mr. Brown will talk with Verizon again for more info.

*CHIPS & Spending

Mr. Brown checked with the County on the CHIPS money and they think it is likely that it will be coming through. We got \$103,000 or \$105,000 last year. Problem is we are down to about \$30,000 in the highway fund. He added he received about \$52,000. for 2019 4th qtr. sales tax. Mr. Brown said he put it in general fund. It used to be done half and half. All bets are off now due to the Covid 19 virus. He said he found out that sales tax is mostly gas sales and with the State tapping into it to support hospitals we are looking at the sales tax revenues to be really down. Discussed CHIPS funding...Mr. Edwards stated we have to spend it then get reimbursed. Mr. Brown said problem is last year the CHIPS came in December. Mr. Brown says we are in crappy shape. Problem is right now it doesn't look like there will even be enough money to pay our people. Mr. Brown added that he has also learned there is a \$45,000 payment due on the loader in May that he thought the \$18,000 we just paid covered all that. Mr. Edwards explained to Mr. Santiago how the lease works. The \$18,000 recently paid was to swop out the loader we have had for 2 years for a new one. They change the VIN # on the lease and the lease continues. So this year we have the \$18,000 swop price plus the regular loader payment. We would do this again in 2 years with the swop price maybe being a little higher. At the end of the lease the Town owns the loader. At that point when we change it out for a newer one we won't have a lease payment so we will have a new loader for around \$20,000. Mr. Brown asked if Dean has the contract adding he would like to see it. Mr. Edwards doesn't have it but is sure that a copy can be made available.

Mr. Brown said the three Highway guys just wasted an hour of Loretta's time and an hour of his time today over a difference of \$2.14 over the 10% health insurance contribution. Mr. Brown added that he think he has it figured out that the difference is because of 3 days at the new premium rate. Mr. Santiago said he didn't care what the amount is if it affects their pay it is a just concern.

Mr. Brown thinks there is a lot of overspending for unnecessary items. He pointed out an \$1,100 tool to find underground cable and another bill for tools. Mr. Santiago questioned why we would need an underground tool when we haven't needed one before. Mr. Brown said this is why he asked in his email for only mandatory purchases to be made. Mr. Edwards said all this is budgeted. Mr. Brown says a budget doesn't mean squat, it is just estimates. Mr. Brown said a lot of spending doesn't need to be spent and that is why he is concerned. Mr. Brown wants to entertain a limit on spending. Mr. Edwards said we always under budget what we expect to get for sales tax. Mr. Brown said he is looking at what money is in the checking account. Discussion on the budget. Mr. Santiago asked if this budget was what was projected for 2020 then how did we get from there to here in 6 months. Mr. Edwards said the budget was approved. Mr. Santiago asked if the money has gone somewhere then because it looks like we are in the hole. Mr. Brown said he never really saw the bills before with the way we did them but now he sits down and looks at every bill. He knows enough about stuff to know what he needs and doesn't. He has too many questions about spending. He doesn't think we need the toys. Mr. Edwards said Supt. Eldred should really be here. Then there is mileage...Mr. Brown says what does he get ? a calendar with numbers. There are some even on a Saturday. Who works Saturdays and a couple when she was on holiday in Florida. Mr. Santiago said is this Loretta...Mr. Edwards said this is a question for her. Mr. Santiago said he is well versed in budgets, is the Hwy Supt. within his budget or is he over. He is within his budget. Mr. Edwards said some of this can be explained with the change of bookkeepers. The new bookkeeper paid year-end bills with fiscal year 2020 funds which has the figures showing more expenditures for 2020. Mr. Santiago said it sounds like there are funds missing. Mr. Edwards and Mr. Brown said no they don't think there is any money missing. Mr. Edwards added there are just 2 different styles of bookkeeping.

Mr. Brown can show where we spent unnecessary money. Mr. Santiago said we are looking at a bill to be coming from Clinton Tractor for the mower tractor for about \$3,000 - \$5,000. Maybe ask Supt. Eldred to cut back where he can. Mr. Santiago agreed that there would not be a need for a tool that they haven't needed in the past because we would call to have them mark the underground cable. Mr. Brown questioned the \$8,000 sign purchase last month. Mr. Edwards and Mr. Santiago agree that if he is within his budget then there is nothing the Board can do. Mr. Brown said that the Highway budget was 270 % over budget at the end of the year. Mr. Brown will bring in the December report. Talked last year of maybe getting rid of the grader...he recently spent \$700 on new glass for it. We don't have the money to make everything beautiful. Again, Supt. Eldred should be here to defend his position. The whole Board should be here. Mr. Santiago said we need to see where we are and where we are heading in a few years with spending. Mr. Brown asked Mr. Edwards if he knew we spent \$300,000 out of reserves in the past few years. Mr. Edwards said what happened was that we didn't get any new equipment for almost 20 years. Mr. Edwards explained how the money from mortgage tax, with the pharmacy refinancing, helped in funding the purchase of the newer equipment we have ... 3 times we came into over \$100,000 each time. Mr. Santiago asked at what point we will need to take a loan out. Mr. Brown said that we are going to be short in anticipated revenues this year....maybe CHIPS funds...sales tax but not how it has been. Reserves has \$319,000. Mr. Brown is going by what the bookkeeper tells him, he isn't a bookkeeper and he is looking at the bank account. Mr. Brown said he did put the \$52,436 sales tax in highway. Mr. Santiago asked if anticipated revenues come in, will we be fine ? Mr. Brown said where is it going to come from? Mr. Santiago asked what is the plan....raise taxes? What percentage? Right now he is confused. Mr. Santiago said he would like to see something from the bookkeeper.

Mr. Brown asked for authority to hire a guy who used to work for the comptroller's office to come in and look at everything. Mr. Edwards asked what this person will do...can't the bookkeeper do this. Mr. Brown said she does payroll and bookkeeping....you get a report. Mr. Santiago asked if this guy does like an audit ? Mr. Wansor used to use Gary Clark. There is \$750 in the budget. Mr. Edwards doesn't see this ... the Supt. is not over his budget. Mr. Brown responded that the budget isn't money its like funny money...what you would like to do, money in the bank is what you pay bills with. Mr. Brown doesn't recall what the name of the guy is, Mike G. Mr. Brown said we haven't spent any of this money but we are fiscally responsible and responsible to the taxpayers. Mr. Santiago would like someone to come in and give us a true assessment on....tell us where this boat is going and project what we need to do in the future... are we going to have to raise taxes? Mr. Edwards asked how much he charges. Mr. Brown thinks that it is \$30 -\$40 / hour. Mr. Edwards asked for a better description of what this guy will do. Mr. Santiago said he has no problem as long as it is within the \$750 budgeted. Mr. Edwards again asked for a better description. Mr. Santiago keeps hearing about this big hole. Mr. Santiago said we should get the information on what he charges and get in touch with the Board. Mr. Santiago moved, Mr. Proskine seconded, to authorize Supervisor Brown to contact this guy, Mike G., to find out what he charges, let the Board know and if within our budget have him look at the books, discussion. Mr. Edwards wants a description of what he is going to do and what he will accomplish. He added the only revenue he sees going down is sales tax and we have always under budgeted that. Mr. Brown said the next sales tax will be in May and will probably be less than half. Mr. Brown says we are beating a dead horse. Those in favor Mr. Santiago, Mr. Proskine, Mr. Brown. Opposed: Mr. Edwards, motion carried.

***Town Website**

Mr. Proskine asked about the website. Mr. Brown said it is coming along....getting close.

*Park Pavilion Use

Mr. Edwards inquired about a target date for people to use the pavilions. Right now there is not a date. Following discussion, it was decided to go with June 1st. This may have to be changed depending when the Governor raises restrictions due to the Covid 19 virus.

Payment of Bills

Mr. Santiago moved, Mr. Edwards seconded, to authorize payment of the bills, discussion, all ayes.

*2020-2021 Snow and Ice Contract with Chenango County

The proposal is for the crossroads in the hamlet (CR 23A, 23B and 23C) as well as part of CR 31. They took CR 23 away from beginning to Blanding Rd. Supt. Eldred doesn't want to burn any bridges but he feels that North Norwich shouldn't have any taken away unless they cut other Towns back as well. Supervisor Brown said he would talk with DPW Director Shawn Fry and maybe someone on the Highway Comm. Mr. Eldred asked that he request a 4 year contract where the County cannot take any roads away from the Town but could add. Mr. Edwards said Mr. Brown should try to get CR32 back. The Town travels over that in both directions everytime and it makes no sense for the County to keep it. The contract will be put on hold at this time.

* NYSEG LED Streetlighting

The cost to convert all the streetlights in all 4 of the streetlighting districts to LED is \$2,081.87. NYSEG has estimated the savings is approx \$5,064 annually. The Clerk stated the cost of the conversion should be charged to the streetlighting districts. Reports

Mr. Proskine moved, Mr. Santiago seconded to accept the following reports, discussion: Mr. Edwards is still looking over the Supervisor/Bookkeeper report and findings from the previous bookkeeper and may have some questions. Mr. Santiago agreed that he is also looking it over. Mr. Brown stated that we will move ahead with the meeting and come back to this.

*Hazard Mitigation Plan

The Town received an email from Kate Long with Tetra Tech who is supporting Chenango County in the uodate of the Hazard Mitigation Plan. She is reaching out to meet with Town Officials to go over the update. Mr. Brown will check with the County to confirm that they are working with them and that there is no cost to the Town.

Old Business

*Head Start Lease

Mr. Jeffrey moved, Mr. Edwards seconded, to authorize Supervisor Broqwn to sign the lease with Opportunities for Chenango (Head Start), discussion, all ayes. The lease runs from April 1, 2020 – December 31, 2121 and is \$1,000 monthly.

*Red Hawk Security

JCAP authorized \$14,005 for security in the Courts. The Town would be responsible for funding the remainder of the security for the Town Hall and Highway Garage, Mr. Edwards questioned whether we should follow through with installing security for the remainder of the building at this time. He referred to the people attending February's meeting questioning the necessity of a security

system for the Town Hall other than what the Courts are paying for. Mr. Brown thinks it is sensible to move forward with the security system pointing out that they budgeted for it. Mr. Edwards pointed out that Mr. Brown has referred to the budget as funny money for the past couple months. Mr. Brown said they aren't ready for approval of anything tonight because we don't have solid figures. Highway Supt. Eldred suggested the sales rep for Red Hawk attend the next meeting and present it at the next meeting with actual cost figures.

***Town Attorney**

The current Town Attorney contract is through July 31st. There is a provision in the agreement that a 30 day notice is required to terminate the agreement. Mr. Brown reminded the Board that he would like to go with Aaron Dean as a Town Attorney. He has agreed to work for the \$2,000. that is budgeted and would attend our Town Board meetings. Mr. Proskine moved, Mr. Santiago seconded, to move forward with a 30 day notice to David Merzig and hire Aaron Dean effective August 1, 2020 for a retainer fee of \$2,000./ annually, discussion, Ayes: Proskine, Jeffrey, Santiago, Brown Opposed: Edwards Motion Carried.

*Cell Tower

Mr. Brown reported that the proposed cell tower is not in our backyard but is going to be located nearby on property owned by Barry Matteson II. This will allow for more consistent cell phone coverage in our area. Supt. Eldred suggestd the Town could get repeater access on this new cell tower.

*Septic Permits

Mr. Edwards asked Mr. Prisco if he inspects septic systems. Yes, he does. The County issues and inspects all building permits in the Town.

New Business

*Grievance Day Update

Tom Curtis, Board of Assessment Review Chairman, spoke to the Board about the outcome of grievance day. Mr. Curtis said the BAR reviewed 12 grievances and reduced all but 1. The overall reduction in assessed valuation was \$240,500. Mr. Curtis explained that the area that these properties are located take a big hit with Norwich City School district taxes and the Norwich Fire taxes. He added that a re-val is probably the right thing to do but doesn't give the right results. The equalization rate is a bogus number. Having a value on a property at +/- 10 % is good. Assessor Shelly Harris pointed out that if the Town wanted to do a re-val it would have to be a few year process. When the equalization rate drops you get a bigger portion of the tax pie. Mr. Edwards asked if there is any plan for the County to do anything. No. Mrs. Harris told the Board that she actually had added \$383,900 in value to this year's tax roll so even though, through grievance, they lost \$240,500 they still are on the plus side. She also told the Board that the actual tax dollar loss on the \$240,500 is approx \$1,125. Supervisor Brown expressed kudos to the Assessor for getting the \$383,000 increase this year.

Mrs. Harris asked the Board to please contact her with any questions or concerns they should have.

*Budget Planning and Process / handout

Supervisor Brown told the Board about a recent webinar he viewed concerning budgets. The more you plan the better your proposed budget will be. Mr. Brown stated he has a meeting with Mike G., Consultant, coming up on the 19th. He asked Mr. Santiago to attend as well. Mr. Edwards asked what time. Mr. Brown indicated it is a work session with Mike G. Mr. Edwards that is fine but he would like to attend. Mr. Brown said it is not a meeting, if he is there then there is a quorum. Mr. Edwards said the Clerk can advertise the work session and asked what time. Mr. Edwards again asked what time on the 19th. Mr. Brown said he doesn't want him there. Mr. Brown added he would have to ask Mike G. about Mr. Edwards attending. Mr. Edwards said he works for us (the Town) so it isn't his decision to make. Mr. Brown said the meeting works better when there are less people congesting it. Mr. Brown said the meeting is at his home not at the Town Hall and he doesn't have a time yet. Mr. Edwards told Mr. Brown to make a phone acall and find out. Mr. Brown told Mr. Edwards that he is now telling him what to do. Mr. Edwards said he is he wants to attend the meeting he just needs the time.

*Speeding on CR 23A

The Clerk reported that there has been a resident of CR 23A in complaining that there is a lot of speeding on that street. He would like the Sheriff's Dept. or State Police to patrol the area more.

Public Concern or Input

due to the Covid-19 threat the meeting was not open to the public.

Tom Curtis asked the Supt. Eldred to explain the pros and cons to leasing of the trucks and equipment. Supt. Eldred explained to him

the advantage of leasing. Mr. Curtis also pointed out that this Town Board needs to work together to work on a budget for next year. It is going to be a really tough year. Mr. Curtis was also inquiring about how much it cost per man at the highway, salary, health ins. Retirement, etc. He thinks it is probably about \$75,000/ year. Supt. Eldred doesn't think it is that high but doesn't have figures. They need to put a budget together and maybe have a contingency plan if sales tax revenues look like they are going to be drastically reduced.

*Galena Park – Covid 19 restictions

Mr. Santiago mvoed, Mr. Jeffrey seconded, to allow the Clerk to rent out the pavilions beginning July 1st, discussion, all ayes.

*Clean Outside of Town Hall building

Supt. Eldred will get 3 estimates for pressure washing the Town Hall before the next meeting.

Highway

*Highway Supt. Report

Supt. Eldred emailed his May report to all the Board members. The report is on file in the Town Clerk office. NYS has released CHIPS funds. He will be getting the paperwork in by June 15th for re-imbursement for what has been paid so far. There may be a 20% cut by the Governor that would affect the remaining anticipated re-imbursement payments.

Questions from Bookkeeper / Supervisor Report

Mr. Edwards questioned why there is a negative figure for the Court Clerk line item. Clerk Smith said that it looks like it has been separated from the Justice line item where both the Justice and Court Clerk salaries were combined. At the end of the year the negative balance will be offset by the remaining balance in the Justice salary line item. Mr. Edwards then asked about the Bookkeepers purchase of checks in January of about \$900 and now ordering more checks for the new bookkeeper \$160. Supervisor Brown opened the meeting thanking Clerk Smith and Board Member Joe Santiago for meeting with Consultant Mike Giovinazzo and himself last friday. He believes that it was a good meeting resulting in the proposed budget that the Clerk has provided. He further stated all we need to do is adopt it as a preliminary so that we can set a hearing date.

Clerk Smith agreed it was a very productive meeting and stated, to come up with this proposed budget, it was decided to transfer \$46,500 from equipment reserves into the 2021 budget to cover the 2 lease payments on the new loader and new truck. Also, at the November 10, 2020 meeting the Board will need to authorize a transfer of \$20,000 from General fund to Highway fund. This will reduce the unexpended balance for General from \$35,000 to \$15,000 and give Highway \$20,000 in unexpended funds. Mr. Giovinazzo said that this budget allows us to be under the tax cap so there is no need to adopt a local law to override. Overall the combined General and Highway tax rate will go from \$4.68 to \$4.81. Example, on a \$100,000 assessment the tax bill would be up \$12.00.

Good news is the 3^{rd} quarter sales tax check is up by 5.28% for a total of \$67,142.58. This brings the total sales tax received for 2020 to \$218,605.44 which is \$30,155.44 more than what was anticipated. Clerk Smith suggests that the \$30,155.44 extra be put into the Highway fund. This amount is 2/3 of the total equipment payment and can be put toward the payment in 2022.

Following short discussion, Mr. Santiago moved, Mr. Jeffrey seconded, to adopt the 2021 Preliminary Budget and to hold a public hearing on said budget on Wednesday, October 28, 2020 at 6:30 pm, discussion, all ayes.

Mr. Brown informed everyone that overall we are up 2.7% but still under the tax cap.

Tom Curtis asked about the CHIPS funding. Highway Supt. Eldred said that CHIPS is protected unless the State is in a state of emergency which is where we have been with the pandemic. Really won't know much more until next year. We will only spend it if we are going to get it.

Mr. Edwards moved, Mr. Jeffrey seconded, to close the hearing at 6:47 pm.
